## BYC POOL RULES – REVISED MAY 12, 2014

- 1. The lifeguard must be on duty and the pool must be officially open before any user is allowed in the water or pool area.
- 2. All persons using the pool or pool area do so at their own risk and in conformance with all rules and regulations. Individuals may be barred from the pool or pool area at the discretion of the lifeguard in charge for violation of said rules, or for any other reason which in his/her judgment constitutes a hazard to others or to the management.
- 3. Guests must be accompanied by a member at all times. When a member leaves, the guest must also leave.
- 4. Members will be held responsible for all actions of their guests.
- 5. The cost of any property damage will be charged to the responsible member.
- 6. BYC will not be responsible for loss or damage to any personal property.
- 7. The pool may be closed at any time due to mechanical breakdown, operational difficulties, or inclement weather. The decision is at the sole discretion of management.
- 8. All swimmers shall exit the pool at the lifeguard's request.
- 9. All bathers must shower before entering the pool. Bathhouses, showers, and sanitary facilities are provided.
- 10. Children under the age of 12 must be accompanied by a Parent/Guardian of 18 years of age or older. Parent/Guardian must closely watch children at all times. Parent/Guardian must accompany a non-swimmer in the water at all times.

- 11. Infants and children wearing diapers or who are not toilet trained shall be permitted in the pool, but must wear swim diapers... In the event of fecal contamination, the pool will be closed in accordance with Health Department regulations.
- 12. Running, pushing, wrestling, or causing undue disturbance in or about the pool area will not be tolerated. Spouting of water and similar unhygienic acts will not be permitted in the pool.
- 13. No abusive or profane language or breach of the peace will be tolerated.
- 14. No pets allowed in the pool area at any time.
- 15. No radios or audio equipment permitted.
- 16. Baby strollers and baby carriages are not permitted within 5 feet of the pool.
- 17. Chewing gum is not permitted in the pool area at any time.
- 18. Only proper type bathing suits are permissible. Cut-offs are not permitted in the pool.
- 19. Admission shall be refused to all persons having infectious disease, sore or inflamed eyes, colds, nasal or ear discharges, or any communicable disease of any kind. Persons with excessive sunburn, open sores, or bandages of any kind will be permitted.
- 20. No food can be brought into the pool area. Glass containers (i.e. baby food, drink bottles, etc.) are not permitted in the pool area.
- 21. All drinks must be kept at the perimeter of the pool.
- 22. Smoking is not permitted in the pool area.

- 23. Only one person is permitted on the diving board at a time. The individual on the diving board may bounce only one time on the end of the diving board and must go straight off the diving board. The diving well must be clear before anyone can go off the diving board.
- 24. All personal injuries, however slight, must be reported to the lifeguard on duty.
- 25. The last 10 minutes of each hour will be for ADULTS ONLY Swimming.
- 26. Inner tubes, water wings, and all other flotation devices for the purpose of supporting non-swimmers are not permitted at any time. For safety purposes, only a life vest approved by the United States Coast Guard is to be used. If a child uses such a life vest, a parent or guardian must accompany the child in the water at all times.
- 27. Flotation mats, rafts, inner tubes, and water wings are not permitted in the pool area at any time.
- 28. Prolonged underwater swimming, breath-holding, or games including such behavior is prohibited.
