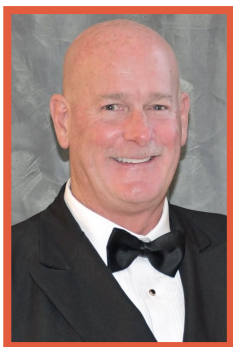

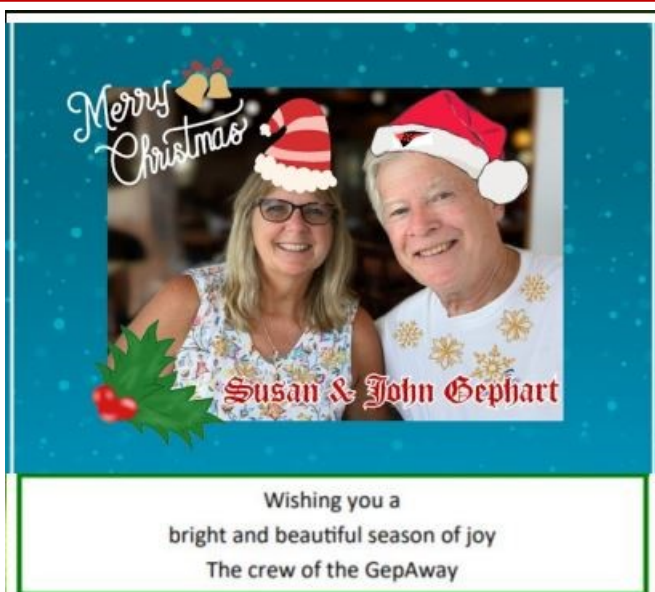

PROGRESS REPORT

There's an air of optimism around Sue Island these days, now that the membership has approved funds for a series of improvements to the Baltimore Yacht Club which will, it is devoutly hoped, attract new members, accommodate more boats, and make the present members much happier.

On the agenda (not necessarily in this order) are the following projects:

1. Dredge the inshore areas of the center of the yacht basin by a "sucker" dredge which will deposit the silt from the basin in the swamp area south of the sandspit.

2. Build a new pier for a short distance westward from the bank between C and D piers, to accommodate 12 new slips.

3. Add more usable slips at the inshore ends of C & D piers by dredging and by re-arrangement of the piling.

4. Add more usable slips on A and B piers by dredging greater depth and by re-arrangement of the piles.

Moving inside the clubhouse, we have several projects: (also not necessarily in this order)

1. Renovate and enlarge the kitchen.

2. Improve the lighting, put in a new ceiling and re-decorate the dining room.

3. Construct a lounge on the east side of the building with picture-window views out over the Bay and Bowl-eyes. This would be air conditioned for summer and would have its own heating system for winter.

Some time in the future there is a swimming pool in the offing, although discussions have not gotten around to details on this project, as the others are deemed more pressing. There is, for example, now a fire department limit on the number of persons permitted to use the first floor of the clubhouse at any one time, and the additional space represented by the lounge is regarded as highly important.

In case you missed the meetings, here's how things were arranged:

The Baltimore Yacht Club Holding Corporation, which actually owns the island and which rents it to the Baltimore Yacht Club for a break-even rental (The Holding Corp must pay taxes, etc.) set up a series of criteria some time ago against which the Yacht Club Officers had to measure any capital expenditure projects.

These included the organization of a financial—operations committee to scrutinize all plans and all expenditures; detailed drawings and estimates of cost on all projects; and a sound means for financing each project.

Commodore Alex Smick and his officers, cooperating with Past Commodore Paul Tignor who is President of the Holding Corp. appointed such a committee, headed by Past Commodore Karl Thau. There are eleven members, including the Rear Commodore, Fleet Captain, Secretary and Treasurer of the Yacht Club; the Secretary and Treasurer of the Holding Corporation; the Club's House & Grounds chairman, and various others.

Arrangements have now been made (and have been approved by the Membership of the Yacht Club as well as the officers and committee) to borrow sums not to exceed \$75,000 from the Kingsville Bank at an interest rate of 5 and a half per cent.

This does not mean that all that money comes into Yacht Club accounts at once. It means the money will be borrowed as it is needed to pay bills for these capital improvements, and interest will be paid on the sums only as they are used.

Now, how do we repay? The new slips in the basin are, of course, self-liquidating, so not much worrying is done about them re-paying the approximately \$10,000 they will cost (with the dredging.) However, this cost, and the basis:

rest of the loan will be repaid on this

The sum of \$12 will be taken from each slip-rental and from each membership dues. This will approximate \$6,000 per year.

A small monthly assessment of \$2.50 per member will be levied on all members. With a membership in excess of 300, this will yield \$9,000 per year.

The items above (sums from dues, slip rentals and assessments) will aggregate some \$15,000 per year. This will be ample to repay a \$75,000 loan with interest.

But it must be pointed out here that the actual outlays of money will probably be something short of the maximum. As Past Commodore Thau has pointed out many times to his committee: "We will go ahead carefully. If at any time it looks like we may run into trouble, we can stop where we are and pay only for the money we have used."

He added that his financial-operations committee will scrutinize each plan in all its details and will not approve any of them until and unless all details are satisfactory.

Much progress has already been made. Detailed drawings for the dredging and new slips have been submitted by Rear Commodore Patten and have been approved. Following obtention of necessary permits and final bids this work in the basin will commence.

House and Grounds Chairman George Mills has submitted floor-plan layouts for kitchen improvements and dining room refurbishing. These are being studied at this writing and by the time this is in print in *THE SPRAY* there should be substantial progress, a report on which will have to await next month's issue of the club magazine.

Many men of more than ordinary

ability are giving generously of their time and talents to bring these plans to fruition. They ask only the generous cooperation and sympathetic understanding of the membership to help us to progress.

Things are quiet on the piers these days as most of our boats are now snug in their winter beds as visions of next season dance in their owners' heads.

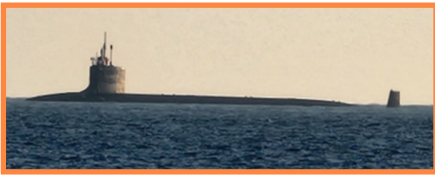

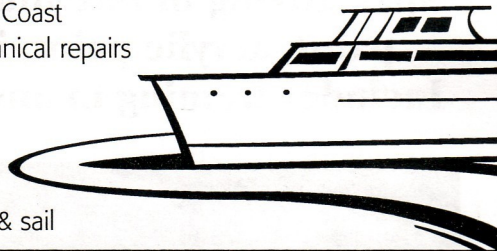
