Speaking of south Florida, Kathy and I recently enjoyed a wonderful wine tasting event by our own D Pier "Wine Lady" P/FL Deb Penczek at the home of Marley P/C Patti Rome in Cape Coral, Fl. Wayne and I served as the token guys attending. The wines and the food were tasty, and we all learned a little bit more about wine.

Some folks have a knack for nautical misadventure. Susan Gephart reports that Past YCM Skunk Flag winner, "Power Tower" John, fell from their runabout while it was on the trailer on land at the club and broke his hip. As of this article, John was in a rehab center another week and then will continue to recover at home. His spirits are great and we all look forward to a full recovery!

Finally, below is a story of boating travel and adventure sent in from the D Pier vessel AT LAST, captained by John Hall. I have included it as sent in with only minor edits for clarity.

"It's 6:45 am on November 3, John Hall, Rick Kammann, Jim and Colleen Smart departed BYC on AT LAST for Port Canaveral, Florida. Our time frame for travel was 9 days, but we arrived in 6 days. It was a calm and pleasant ride down the Chesapeake Bay and our first stop was Chesapeake, Virginia at the Great Bridge. Day 2 started at 7am, leaving Virginia and heading into North Carolina and having to dodge crab pots, we thought we were back in the Chesapeake Bay. Our stop that night found us docked at Jarrett Bay, North Carolina and the crew went window shopping that evening in the yard, looking at yachts that ranged from 70 feet to 120 feet.

Day 3 our plan was to head out into the Atlantic Ocean by Morehead City, North Carolina and running about 6 hours until we came back into the ICW around Wrightsville Beach and continuing to Southport, South Carolina only to find the crew anchored that night at Dutchman Creek.

Days 4 & 5, all crew accounted for and AT LAST headed back out to the Atlantic Ocean for a spectacular sunrise and only 351 nautical miles away from our destination. We saw sizable sea turtles and dolphins playing in our port and Starboard wakes. This would start our 28 hours tour this time since the Greek Gods of Poseidon and Oceanus was very kind to us giving us short swells of no to moderate height. We pulled into Fernandina Harbor, Florida and docked by 11am, giving the crew a day off. Day 6 found us off the dock and headed back to sea with even calmer waters in the Ocean – some swells were widely spaced.

As we enjoyed our passage down the ocean and we questioned what light house, marker or whatever that maker was off to our port side. Low and behold, a US Submarine surfaced! This was a first for us. We arrived in Port Canaveral, Florida by 4:30pm and were greeted by Mary Hall on the dock to help with stern lines. Our first full day at dock on Thursday found Rick, Jim and Colleen taking the tender out through the lock and exploring. Spotting a manatee, dolphins, and a sand shark. At 8:30 pm John, Rick, Jim, and Colleen watched Space X CRS 29 Falcon 9 launch at 8:30pm."

With AT LAST securely docked, Rick and John headed home that weekend while Jim and Colleen went by car to St. Augustine for a week, where so Jim had work assignment.


