





I can't express the importance enough.

By the time you read this, the Club will be open again after its long winter's nap. Only it wasn't actually napping. GM Scott and his crew have been hard at work cleaning and preparing the Club for another year of great member experience's as boating season draws ever so slowly nearer.

I can finally once again say, I look forward to seeing you on the hill!


