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BYC Traditions

Princess

One of the longest standing traditions in the yachting community is that of the Yacht Club Princess. Each year all yacht clubs of the Chesapeake Bay are encouraged to select a young lady to represent their club as Princess. She represents her Yacht Club at sister Club's Commodore's Balls and Yacht Club activities throughout the year of her reign, and attends as many of her Club's events as possible. The Princess is also invited to participate in the annual "Queen of the Chesapeake" pageant, which is held at Maryland Yacht Club, on the Saturday after Father's Day.

Baltimore Yacht Club selected their first Princess in 1948, which was also the first year that Maryland Yacht Club started the "Queen of the Chesapeake" pageant. Our first Princess was Jean Burton, whose father became Commodore in 1969.

BYC structured their Princess pageant similar to the Queen of Chesapeake pageant. One of the requirements to enter the BYC Princess Pageant is that the young lady has to be between the ages of 16 to 21. In the early years, there were always three or more contestants, so a pageant was held each year. The Chairman appointed three judges, who were not from BYC or other yacht clubs, and put together three or four questions that the judges would ask the contestants. The BYC Princess pageant was first held in April, and her reign lasted one year from that day. All members are encouraged to attend the pageant/presentation in September to show their support of these young ladies, who give a lot of their time during the summer and fall, attending sister club's openings and Commodore's balls as well as our own activities and events. Because of the time they spend together during their reign as Princess, these young ladies make friendships that last a lifetime.

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
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Manager's Message

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





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
